1. I have been crucified with Christ.

- A. This brought about a death to the old Law (verse 19), thereby effecting freedom from it.
- B. This brought about a death to one's own "resume," with all worldly achievements.

2. I no longer live, but Christ lives in me.

- A. Once a person dies, life is no longer "about him." He has passed on and life must go on.
- B. To die with Christ is to no longer have life be "about me." Rather, you consider yourself as no longer alive to do as you please.
- C. Rather than be directed by Law, you are now directed by Christ.

3. I now live in the flesh.

- A. But of course, you are still literally alive. So how does a child of God merge this inherent conflict? He has been crucified (died spiritually) but continues to live (physically).
- B. The answer is found in who it is that controls this physical life. For a person to continue to live for self is to be dead to God. For that person to live for God is to be dead to Paul/

4. I live by faith.

- A. Here is the key to one's existence. His life is a life of faith; a trusting obedience to what Christ demands, not what he wants.
- B. His faith is in Christ: (a) The Son of God; (b) The One who Loved; (c) the One who delivered Himself up. HE is someone you can have faith in!
