Personally, we may remember our "first kiss" or our "first car." What do you remember? More importantly, what does God want us to remember?

In Genesis 22, we should remember Abraham's faith when faced with the idea that his son would be killed. They BOTH had faith in God. They BOTH understood that God would provide. They did not know exactly HOW God would provide... but He did! Do you remember how?

The Israelites were led out of Egyptian bondage (see Numbers 11). As they wandered, they "remembered" with longing and desired Egypt's food again. All they had to eat was manna, day after day manna! God provided for them every day. Does He not do the same for us? They may not have received steak and potato from Texas Road House, but God did not let them starve. They may have gone "stir crazy" in their wilderness tents, seemingly all alone with no place to go. And still God had a plan. God wanted to bring them to the land of Canaan. They couldn't see His future and many complained and died in the wilderness. Do you remember?

Have you ever wondered what's going on today? Why are things happening this way? Why a pandemic? What is God doing? I don't know why exactly, but this I do know: God provides for us. He is fully aware of the future. He will take care of us. God has His reasons for why things happen. We may see His providence by "looking back" and remembering. Will we remember?

Does it feel like God is putting us in the wilderness (our homes)? Is He making us cook our own steak and potatoes? Is He feeding us manna (that "whatever we find in the house when we wake up in the morning" to eat)? Does it feel like God is testing our faith? Is God checking to see if our heart is right? Will we remember Him during this time in our life?

Deuteronomy 8:2 tells us "You shall remember that the LORD your God led you all the way these forty years in the wilderness, to humble you and test you, to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not." Have we ever "tested" children to see if they really love us? Are they really obedient? When we tell our child about the danger of walking in the street, do they listen? Do we rescue them when there is no danger? Or do we scold them for walking in the street even when no car is moving toward them at the time? What joy it brings to a parent when a child is in a store parking lot and says, "Please hold my hand." Then we know our child "got it!" Is that kinda like what God wants us to remember? Does He desire a child-like trust in Him? Yes, hold His hand. Remember to let God lead you today.

Psalms 103:17-18 ...Receive His mercy. Keep His covenant. Remember His commandments.

We have time to reflect on God and what He wants us to remember. Remember Jesus our Savior was born to redeem us as He promised. Remember, God is faithful. He is working things together for good to those that love Him (1 Corinthians 10:13).

Remember God in this time of "social distancing" and protect one another (Romans 8:28). Remember God's peace - even when "stuck at home" and possibly going bonkers with nothing to do (Philippians 4:6-7). Remember that God provides when you are eating His "daily bread" (1 Corinthians 10).
